Dr. Palmer has held executive leadership positions at various biotech and pharmaceutical companies. Notably, she served as the Chief Medical Officer at Gannex/Ascleris, a liver disease company, and led global liver disease clinical development at Kadmon (acquired by Sanofi) and Takeda (which acquired Shire).
